

## **Institutional Course Learning Outcomes Addendum for English Language Proficiency and Numeracy**

Canterbury Christ Church University courses are designed to meet all expectations of the Office for Students, this includes the expectations for English language proficiency and numeracy. The following learning outcomes are approved as institutional course learning outcomes and apply to the levels of study and award for the relevant approved course.

These become applicable from the point of the first intake in 2023 and remain in place until the course learning outcomes are revised with course specific learning outcomes which explicitly cover the matters of English language proficiency and numeracy.

It should be noted that numeracy will only apply to those aspects of numeracy relevant to the subject area.

### **Institutional Course Learning Outcomes:**

#### **Level 0**

Demonstrate effective communication, using discipline-specific vocabulary accurately to discuss ideas clearly, handling spelling, punctuation, grammar and numeracy accurately.

#### **Level 4**

Demonstrate effective communication, adapting their writing style to the needs of the brief and using discipline-specific vocabulary accurately to discuss ideas clearly, handling spelling, punctuation, grammar and numeracy accurately.

#### **Level 5**

Demonstrate effective and confident communication, adapting their writing style to the needs of the brief and using discipline-specific vocabulary accurately to discuss ideas clearly, handling spelling, punctuation, grammar and numeracy accurately.

#### **Level 6**

Demonstrate fluent, effective and confident communication, adapting their writing style to the needs of the brief and using discipline-specific vocabulary accurately to discuss complex ideas clearly, handling spelling, punctuation, grammar and numeracy accurately.

#### **Level 7**

Demonstrate fluent, effective and confident writing with structured and coherent arguments. Students adapt their writing style to the needs of the brief sensitively and use discipline-specific vocabulary accurately to present complex ideas clearly while defending their own original conclusions. Spelling, punctuation, grammar and numeracy are handled accurately.
